



## FAQ – Vaccination Proof for Volunteers

- 1. If I'm required to be vaccinated, then how come the kids aren't?**

Those receiving services are not required to be vaccinated. Those who are providing services are required to be vaccinated. We do encourage our youth and young adults to get vaccinated.
- 2. Which vaccine do I need and how many doses do I need in order to volunteer?**

The federal mandate requires volunteers to receive their primary vaccination series which consists of the single-dose Johnson & Johnson (J&J) vaccine or both doses of a multi-dose Pfizer or Moderna vaccine for COVID-19.
- 3. I'm not vaccinated but still want to volunteer on-site, can't I just take a COVID test?**

As per the Supreme Court ruling and Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services mandate, all individuals who are in contact with the youth and young adults served by The Relatives must be fully vaccinated and show proof of vaccination.
- 4. I have never been asked for this information before, why now?**

Because The Relatives receives federal funding, we have to have to abide by the mandate and the January 13<sup>th</sup> Supreme Court ruling.
- 5. Are there other ways I can volunteer if I am not vaccinated?**

Absolutely! We always have a need for virtual activities, virtual workshops, virtual GED tutoring, meal drop offs, and snack pack making (off-site).
