



Addressing Youth Experiencing Homelessness in Charlotte



1 IN 10 YOUNG ADULTS, AGES 18-25 EXPERIENCES SOME FORM OF HOMELESSNESS OVER THE COURSE OF A YEAR.

45,500 DISCONNECTED YOUTH IN CLT 14.5% OF ALL YOUNG PEOPLE (AGES 16-24) IN THE METRO AREA



AT THE RELATIVES...

600-650 SERVED PER YEAR AT ON RAMP, 41 HOUSED PLUS 12 CHILDREN

DREAMING BIG...

1,200-1,500 TO BE SERVED PER YEAR AT NEW FACILITY, 65 WILL BE HOUSED IN 2021

YOUNG PEOPLE (UP TO AGE 25) WITH NO GED/HS DIPLOMA – **345%** HIGHER RISK OF HOMELESSNESS*

51% OF OUR CASE MANAGEMENT CLIENTS HAVE NO HS DIPLOMA OR GED

79% OF ON RAMP CASE MANAGEMENT PARTICIPANTS IDENTIFYING AN EDUCATIONAL NEED ENROLLED IN EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.



Nationally:*

YOUNG PEOPLE (UP TO AGE 25) WITH ANNUAL INCOME LESS THAN \$24K – **162%** HIGHER RISK OF HOMELESSNESS



THE ON RAMP RESOURCE CENTER TARGETS YOUNG ADULTS WHO ARE AT OR BELOW 200% OF THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL AND WHO ARE DISCONNECTED FROM THE COMMUNITY. OVER **30%** OF THE YOUNG ADULTS SEEKING SERVICES AT ON RAMP ARE HOMELESS.

YOUNG PEOPLE (UP TO AGE 25) WHO ARE BLACK/AFRICAN AMERICAN – **83%** HIGHER RISK OF HOMELESSNESS



81% OF PARTICIPANTS AT THE ON RAMP RESOURCE CENTER IDENTIFY AS AFRICAN AMERICAN **90%** OF YOUTH WERE HOUSED WITHIN 45 DAYS OF COMPLETING THEIR HOUSING INTAKE AT THE RELATIVES. (COMPARED TO OVER 200 DAYS COMMUNITY-WIDE)

LGBTQ+ YOUTH – **120%** HIGHER RISK OF HOMELESSNESS



WE DO NOT TRACK THIS NUMBER BUT KNOW THAT WE SERVE MANY YOUNG ADULTS IN THIS POPULATION. **100%** OF YOUTH DID NOT RETURN TO THE STREET OR SHELTERS WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF RECEIVING HOUSING SUBSIDY ASSISTANCE.

PARENTING YOUTH – **200%** HIGHER RISK OF HOMELESSNESS



35% OF HOUSING CLIENTS CURRENTLY ARE PARENTING YOUTH; 6 MONTHS AFTER RECEIVING HOUSING ASSISTANCE, **95%** REMAINED STABLY HOUSED.
